

SUBJECT: DM 15-478 Everyday Energy, LLC d/b/a Energy Rewards
Request for Extension of Application Period for Registration as a
Competitive Electric Power Supplier

On March 9, 2016, Everyday Energy, LLC d/b/a Energy Rewards (Everyday Energy) requested a waiver of Puc 2003.04(h) and an extension to April 30, 2016 of the review period for its application to register as a competitive electric power supplier (CEPS), which currently expires on March 11, 2016. In its request, Everyday Energy stated that it is awaiting electronic data interchange (EDI) testing start dates from Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy (Eversource).

Everyday Energy stated that it will file an update to the status of all responses in its initially filed application to address any material changes from the date the application was originally filed, including responses regarding states in which Everyday Energy currently conducts business, complaints, and any convictions of applicant principals. In addition, Everyday Energy stated it is aware of all items still listed as deficient and required to complete its application, including extending the expiration date of its surety bond to be no earlier than one year and seven business days after the projected date that all EDI testing and training is completed.

On November 12, 2016, Staff sent a deficiency letter to Everyday Energy requesting additional information required to complete its application, including a statement from each utility for the service areas in which Everyday Energy intends to operate that it has demonstrated EDI capability. Pursuant to Puc 2003.04(h), Everyday Energy is required to provide the information requested in Staff's letter on or before March 11, 2016.

Staff believes that Everyday Energy's estimated date for filing proof of completion of EDI training and testing, on or before April 30, 2016, is reasonable. Staff therefore recommends that the Commission approve Everyday Energy's request for a waiver of Puc 2003.04(h) and an extension of its application review period until April 30, 2016.
