Electric Distribution Utilities - Development of New Alternative Net Metering Tariffs

Dear Director Howland:

On December 21, 2016, the Commission issued Order No. 25,972 in the above-captioned docket. That order granted a Staff motion to approve the implementation of an "interim" net metering tariff that would take effect on March 2, 2017 and end at the time the Commission issues a final order in the docket approving a successor tariff. As part of the order, the Commission required each utility, including Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy ("Eversource") to file revised tariff pages to implement the interim tariff.

On January 10, 2017, Eversource filed a letter in the docket stating that it had reviewed its tariff and believed the language in it to be adequate, and that no revisions were necessary. Subsequently, Commission Staff contacted Eversource and stated that it believed certain revisions to the tariff were required to comply with Order No. 25,972. Accordingly, Eversource provides the enclosed tariff pages incorporating reference to the requirements of Order No. 25,972. Because this revised submission is provided after the period specified in the Commission's Order, Eversource requests that, to the extent necessary, the Commission waive the deadline in the Order and accept this submission. In that the new tariff will not take effect until after March 2, 2017, Eversource submits that any waiver will not prejudice any party or person.
