Dear Commissioner Quiram,

Under the **New Hampshire Right to Know Law R.S.A. Ch. 91-A et seq.**, I am requesting an opportunity to inspect or obtain copies of public records that **pertain to the proposal by Green City Power to purchase Concord Steam. I would like to receive all communications beginning in May of 2015 between and about Green City Power and members of the Department of Administrative Services, including communications with Green City Power, the Public Utilities Commission staff, Concord Steam, members of the Legislative Task Force, the Governor and Governor's Office, members of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, and the Executive Council members and office.** Electronic records are preferred.

If there are any fees for searching or copying these records, please inform me if the cost will exceed \$500.00. However, I would also like to request a waiver of all fees in that the disclosure of the requested information is in the public interest and will contribute significantly to the public's understanding of the Department of Administrative Services decision not to consider or present the Green City Power proposal to the Public Utilities Commission, the Legislative Task Force or the general public. Since the purchase of natural gas from Liberty Utilities will increase by over 170,000 mcf, and the cost of the conversion for state buildings is estimated at \$25 Million, all of these expenses to be borne by NH taxpayers, I feel this information is in the public interest. I will use and analyze this information for educational purposes in letters to the editor and online blogs. This information is not being sought for commercial purposes.

The New Hampshire Right to Know Law requires a response time of five business days. If access to the records I am requesting will take longer than this amount of time, please contact me with information about when I might expect copies or the ability to inspect the requested records.

If you deny any or all of this request, please cite each specific exemption you feel justifies the refusal to release the information and notify me of the appeal procedures available to me under the law.
