In this filing, the Company requests changes to the Company's permanent rates that are intended to yield an increase of \$5,683,102 in annual operating revenues to be effective July 1, 2019. To provide time to review the Company's request, the Company also requests a temporary increase in distribution rates of \$2,093,349, also to be effective July 1, 2019. Finally, the Company requests a step increase of \$2,293,431 to begin recovering the cost of capital projects completed through December 31, 2019. The step increase will be effective upon the implementation of permanent rates following the conclusion of the permanent rate case, but no earlier than January 1, 2020.
