Hello Mike,

Staff was reviewing the Motion for Waiver of Puc 1203.02(d) re customer notice of the rate case and has a question:

The waiver requests leave to send the rate case notice with "June bills" but does not specify dates that "June bills" will be mailed.

Staff understands the purpose of the waiver request is to allow a few billing cycles to fall outside the 30 day required period, and so, if granted, most customers would get notice prior to the PHC (tentatively set for 5/30/19) and all customer would get notice before the temp rate hearing (tentatively set for 6/14/19).

But, if June bills means bills mailed from 6/1/ through 6/30, that would leave all cycles without notice before the PHC and many cycles without notice before the temp rate hearing, which seems problematic.

Staff would appreciate Liberty specifying when the rate case notice sent out with "June bills" would actually be sent out, if the requested waiver were granted.

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Important Message for our Customers Regarding Electric Rates

On April 30, 2019, Liberty Utilities ("Liberty") submitted a rate filing with the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission ("PUC") to increase base rates, which recover the cost of the distribution system used to deliver electricity to customers. Customers should expect to see a temporary increase in rates sometime this summer while the PUC reviews Liberty's request. A decision on Liberty's request is expected within twelve months, and the temporary rates will be reconciled with the final approved rates.

Liberty has proposed an annual revenue increase of \$5.7 million. For residential customers using 650 kilowatt hours per month, the monthly bill impact would be approximately \$7.75 or 6.27% as compared to rates in effect today. Bill impacts for commercial and industrial customers will vary.

Petition for Permanent and Temporary Rates Order Suspending Proposed Tariff and Scheduling Prehearing Conference ORDER NO. 26,252

On April 30, 2019, Liberty Utilities (Granite State Electric) Corp. (Liberty or the Company) filed a Petition for Permanent and Temporary Rates with the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (Commission). The petition and subsequent docket filings, other than any information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, are posted at www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbk/2019/19-064.html. Liberty's petition requests that the Commission authorize: (1) an increase in permanent rates to be effective with service rendered on and after July 1,

2019, designed to yield an increase of \$5,683,102 in distribution revenues annually; (2) temporary rates effective with service rendered on and after July

May 13, 2019 This order suspends Liberty's proposed tariffs for temporary and permanent rate increases pending further investigation. It also schedules a Prehearing

1, 2019, designed to yield an increase of \$2,093,349 in distribution revenues annually, pending the Commission's final determination on the Company's request for a permanent rate increase; and (3) a step adjustment in distribution rates designed to yield an increase of \$2,293,431 annually to recover approximately \$15 million of capital investments projected to be made through December 31, 2019, to be effective no earlier than January 1, 2020. Liberty's filing includes direct testimony and exhibits in support of the proposed rates and related supplemental information, including the proposed

tariffs, in accordance with N.H. Code Admin Rules Puc 1600 et seq. Liberty also filed a "Motion For Waiver of Puc 1203.02(d), Customer Notice" requesting waiver of certain notice requirements; a "Motion for Protective Order and Confidential Treatment Regarding Compensation Information, and for Waiver of Puc 203.02 and Puc 203.08" to protect compensation information for its officers and directors from public disclosure; and a "Motion for Waiver of Puc

1605.02, Clean Copy of Tariff" requesting waiver of the requirement that it file a clean and annotated version of its proposed tariff so that it may file only an annotated (red-lined) version. Liberty's filing proposes revised permanent rates for electric service that would increase the Company's total annual distribution revenues by \$5.7 million. Liberty stated that in 2018, its overall earned rate of return was 6.43 percent and that, unless the Commission allows it to charge higher rates, the

Company will not earn a reasonable return on its property that is used and useful in the public service, resulting in confiscation of the Company's property. According to Liberty, the proposed permanent rates would result in a typical monthly bill increase of \$7.75 or 6.27 percent for a residential customer using

650 kWh. The proposed step adjustment would increase a typical monthly bill by an additional \$2.63 for a total proposed monthly bill increase of \$10.38

or 8.40 percent.

Pursuant to RSA 378:27, Liberty also requested temporary rates to be effective with services rendered on and after July 1, 2019, and to stay in place until the Commission decides the permanent rate case. The temporary rates would increase distribution revenues by \$2.1 million annually and result in an approximate typical monthly increase in the total bill of \$2.48 or 2.01 percent for re<mark>sidenti</mark>al customers. The temporary rates would apply to customers in accordance with the existing rate design and all customer class rates would increa<mark>se by the</mark> same percentage.

With its request for permanent rates, Liberty also requested approval of the following additional measures: (1) increased spending and cost recovery for vegetation management programs; (2) a revenue decoupling mechanism that would remove the link between Liberty's sales to its customers and its revenues; (3) increased fees Liberty charges larger customers to connect with its distribution system; (4) increased fees Liberty charges to extend its dis-

tribution lines; (5) changes to LED street lighting rates and terms; (6) a new electric vehicle charging rate; and (7) several other changes to the Company's tariffs, terms, and conditions.

Liberty's request involves a general increase in rates and requires further investigation. Pursuant to RSA 378:6, I(a), we suspend the proposed tariffs until the Commission has held a hearing and ruled on the merits of the proposed rates. Liberty's filing raises, inter alia, issues related to whether the proposed temporary and permanent rates are just, reasonable, and lawful, as required

by RSA 374:2 and 378:7; whether the proposed temporary increases will yield a just and reasonable rate of return on the prudent cost of plant, equipment and capital improvements used and useful in Liberty's provision of service to the public less accrued depreciation, as required by RSA 378:27 and 28;

whether waiver of the customer notice requirements of Puc 1203.02(d) and the filing requirements of 1605.02 are in the public interest; and whether the

protection of officer and director compensation information from public disclosure is appropriate. Each party has the right to be represented by an attorney at the party's own expense.

Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby sion; and it is

ORDERED, that the proposed tariff pages are hereby suspended pursuant to RSA 378:6, I(a), pending investigation and further order of the Commis-FURTHER ORDERED, that a Prehearing Conference, pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.15, be held before the Commission located at 21
