I'm writing again to request that you approve the 2021-2023 energy efficiency plan as updated by the settlement agreement signed by the Consumer Advocate, the Conservation Law Foundation, Clean Energy New Hampshire, and all four of our electric and natural gas utilities.

In **2019** the City Council of In **2019** the City Council of Keene, New Hampshire <u>voted to establish a goal</u> of transitioning the city to 100 percent clean and renewable energy. Keene joined the communities of Concord, Cornish, Hanover, and Plainfield to become the fifth city in the state and the <u>104th in the country</u> to pass similar resolutions. The <u>resolution</u> adopted a goal of using **100% renewable energy for electricity by 2030 and for all sectors including heat and transportation by 2050**.

I attended (remotely) the hearing on December 21st and am very disappointed in the PUC Staff position and testimony. I was alarmed to learn that NH might be left with no SBC funding nor coordinated plan for energy efficiency if the three year plan is rejected.

The **majority of the residents of NH SUPPORT** Clean Energy. Even the Governor supports this.

Do you want your legacy to be of hope for the people of NH or obstruction? This plan helps the economy and the environment of NH.
