To The Public Utility Commissioners:

What were you thinking???

Back in August of this year, we committed to the purchase and installation of a 36k BTU heat pump (mini-split) system provided by Revision Energy (Brentwood NH). Their total price quote included a \$1,140 rebate from EverSource Energy, our electricity supplier. Due to installation delays, because of equipment and manpower shortages, the Revision Energy staff informed us that we would have to wait until sometime this winter for project completion.

Today, we received a notice from Revision Energy advising us that because of the PUC's decision not to accept the NH Utilities' proposed 2021-2023 Energy Efficiency Plan, all energy efficiency rebates have been suspended as of November 23rd. This unprecedented, regressive, short-sighted, sudden, and arbitrary decision, on the PUC's part, impacts New Hampshire Businesses and residents at a time where many of us are trying to reduce our carbon footprint in light of accelerated global warming.

Because of New Hampshire's high electricity costs, our decision to introduce an electric-powered high efficiency heat source, to supplement our woodstove and an aging oil-fired boiler, does not make much sense from a financial perspective. The promised incentive, from the NH Saves Program, was enough to tilt us toward making the decision to commit to "cleaner energy" using new technology.

Would it make the PUC happy to know that, as of today, we are considering "pulling the plug" on the contract?
