## In Case No. 2022-0146, <u>Appeal of Liberty Utilities</u> (<u>EnergyNorth Natural Gas</u>) <u>Corp.</u>, <u>d/b/a Liberty</u>, the court on May 23, 2022, issued the following order:

The joint motion of the New Hampshire Department of Energy and the Office of the Consumer Advocate for summary affirmance is denied. The arguments in the motion may be presented in their briefs.

Appeal from a decision of the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission is accepted and will be scheduled for oral argument before the full court.

This case appears to be eligible for mediation pursuant to Rule 12-A. Under Rule 12-A, the agreement of all parties is required for appellate mediation and a non-refundable fee of \$225 per party will be imposed. If all parties in this case agree to participate in mediation, the petitioner shall submit the completed Appellate Mediation Agreement form to the court on or before June 7, 2022. If an Appellate Mediation Agreement form is not filed, an order will be issued regarding further proceedings.
