Pursuant to Puc 201.05, the Company also requests a waiver of the requirement in Puc 1603.05(b) which requires filings that propose rate changes to include illustrative tariff pages. A waiver is appropriate because the Company filed proposed tariff pages with its Calendar Year 2021 Reconciliation and Rate Adjustment Filing, Docket No. DE 22-014, and because the rate changes resulting from this docket and from Docket DE 22-014 will all be effective as of May 1, 2022, and they will all be implemented through a single compliance tariff shortly after May 1, 2022. Including a proposed tariff page in this filing would also result in confusion. The filing in DE 22-014 included, for example, "Fifth Revised Page 90, Superseding Fourth Revised Page 90." This docket would have included "Sixth Revised

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Page 90, Superseding Fifth Revised page 90," which never went into effect. A waiver is thus appropriate because it will "serve[] the public interest [and] will not disrupt the orderly and efficient resolution of matters before the commission." Puc 201.05(b).
