These tariff pages implement a decrease in the Company's stranded cost recovery charges, a decrease in transmission charges, and an increased charge for the Regulatory Reconciliation Adjustment effective August 1, 2022 as approved by the Commission in the Orders referenced above.

The Commission also approved an increase in the Company's Default Energy Service Rate DE effective August 1, 2022 in its Order No. 26,645 in Docket No. DE 22-021. Revised tariff pages were filed with the Commission in compliance with this Order July 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

Black-lined tariff pages denoting the Regulatory Reconciliation Adjustment, transmission, and stranded cost recovery charge changes effective August 1, 2022 have been submitted for easy identification of the changes.

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Supplemental Information on the Filing

The enclosed “Summary of Rates” reports summarize all the rates and charges in the Company’s tariff by month, rate class and rate component. In addition, we have enclosed a schedule of “Typical Bill Comparisons” based on the rates in effect on May 1, 2022 and the new rates. For a residential customer served under Rate R using 600 kilowatt-hours, the combined effect of all rate changes results in a net increase of \$67 or 49%.

When the new rates are compared to the rates in effect on August 1, 2021 (a similar period), the monthly bill amount for the same residential customer will increase \$76 or 60%.
