6. (a) Summary of the subject matter, or summary of the rule if drafted, and the effect on those regulated:

The Public Utilities Commission's 200 rules govern the Commission's process for handling formal and informal procedures, presently including adjudicative proceedings, rulemaking, alternative regulation, and declaratory rulings. 2021 House Bill 2 created the New Hampshire Department of Energy and transferred portions of the Commission's functions to the Department of Energy, effective July 1, 2021. Pursuant to RSA 12-P:14, as amended by 2022 HB 1258, the Commission has 5 years from July 1, 2021, to amend its rules, including organizational and procedural rules, to reflect this reorganization of functions.

On May 2, 2022, the Commission held an informal stakeholder session at which practitioners provided feedback and suggestions on the Commission's processes. Among the comments provided at that time were various requests that the Commission continue to engage stakeholders in the rulemaking process to update its 200 procedural rules, consistent with the 2021 reorganization.

Based upon this feedback, the Commission is seeking input and public comment prior to drafting its initial proposal for its readopted and amended Puc 200 procedural rules. Subjects of potential input include, but are not limited to:

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- Electronic filing
- Filing deadlines
- Processes for scheduling proceedings
- Discovery, evidentiary, and confidentiality rules
- Post-hearing briefing

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- The rule waiver processes
- Publication and notice requirements
- Remote participation at prehearing conferences and hearings
- Elimination of portions of rules now applicable to the Department of Energy
- Establishment of rules relating to *nisi* orders or other alternative or expedited processes for routine matters
- The establishment of a rule part applicable to investigatory dockets or informal workshops with commissioners or commission advisors/staff
- Communication with advisors or other staff of the Commission
- Alternative dispute resolution or mediation

The Commission's procedural rules affect all participants in proceedings before the Commission, including regulated entities, state agencies (Department of Energy, Office of Consumer Advocate), and other interested parties or stakeholders that initiate or intervene in dockets.
