I recently learned that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

I urge the PUC to accept this Settlement Agreement. I installed A PV array eight years ago. The installation was made financially possible by net metering. Recently we have installed more capacity to support an electric car. We've made our commitment helping the environment and our neighbors by making more clean energy than I use. Again, I made a large capital investment with the belief that net metering would continue to support my efforts, financially. I am counting on my state regulators to keep their end of the bargain and encourage more investment like mine.

I am copying the PUC Clerk on this email so that my concern and support for the Settlement Agreement will be entered into the docket.
