Proposed Procedural Schedule for Remaining Phase I and all Phase II Issues**


Dear Chair Goldner:

I write briefly on behalf of the Community Power Coalition of New Hampshire (CPCNH) to provide comment on the January 31, 2025 letter from Attorney Jessica A. Chiavara on behalf of the Joint Utilities.

CPCNH respectfully urges the Public Utilities Commission not to move the remaining Phase I and Phase II issues into an investigatory docket or to adopt a procedural schedule that is eighteen months or longer. CPCNH would not object to extending the procedural schedule a couple, or even a few months, beyond the schedule it proposed.

CPCNH otherwise takes no position on the remainder of the Joint Utilities' letter.
