**Consideration of Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure, Including
Compensation of Customer-Generators**

**REVISION ENERGY INC.
PETITION TO INTERVENE**

ReVision Energy Inc. (“ReVision”) hereby petitions to intervene in the above-captioned proceeding pursuant to the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission’s (“Commission”) November 18, 2024 Supplemental Order of Notice and in accordance with N.H. Admin. Rules, Puc 203.17, and RSA 541-A:32. In support of this Petition, ReVision states as follows:

1. The November 18, 2024 Supplemental Order of Notice introduces new phases of this proceeding to consider additional changes to New Hampshire’s net metering tariffs and provides that: “Any entity or party seeking to intervene in the proceeding shall file with the Commission a petition to intervene...on or before January 2, 2025” (Supplemental Order of Notice at Page 8).

2. ReVision is an employee-owned, certified B Corp clean energy construction company. ReVision provides engineering, design, installation, and service of solar photovoltaic systems and other distributed energy resources for homes, businesses, municipal buildings, and nonprofit organizations.

3. ReVision’s 470 employee co-owners operate out of five branches across New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and Maine. Over 100 of these employees are located at ReVision’s New Hampshire offices in Brentwood and Enfield. Since 2010, ReVision has installed more than

4,800 solar energy systems in New Hampshire. These systems include net-metered residential, commercial and industrial, and community solar projects.

4. ReVision has intervened and participated in Commission dockets previously, including proceedings directly related to the issues under consideration in this docket. ReVision was actively involved in the legislative process leading to the enactment of HB 1116 (2016). ReVision was granted intervenor status and participated in Docket No. DE 16-576, which was opened in response to HB 1116 and which directly preceded the current docket.

5. ReVision has a direct and substantial interest in the outcome of this proceeding. Any additional changes to the net metering tariff structure will directly affect ReVision's business designing, selling, and installing net-metered distributed energy resources. The outcome of this proceeding will also affect the rights and interests of ReVision's customers who already own or who seek to own distributed generation subject to New Hampshire's net metering tariffs.

6. ReVision's participation in the proceeding is in the interest of justice and will not disrupt the orderly and prompt conduct of this proceeding. ReVision agrees to accept the case as it finds it.

WHEREFORE, ReVision respectfully requests that it be granted full intervenor status in this proceeding.
