Dear Chairman Goldner:

On behalf of Liberty Utilities (Granite State Electric) Corp., I write with a few final comments.

First, Liberty reviewed a draft of Eversource's Final Comments, which recommended that the Commission open a new proceeding to consider proposals for EV managed charging programs. Liberty supports that recommendation.

Second, Liberty asks the Commission to take note of proposals in Liberty's recently filed distribution rate case, Docket No. DE 23-039, when determining in this docket whether current tariffs and programs are sufficient to support demand response and EV charging. In the rate case, Liberty asks that the Commission approve Phase 2 of its battery storage pilot program, Phase 1 of which was approved and implemented through Docket No. DE 17-189. Phase 2 would include additional Liberty-owned batteries and a BYOD program where customers could take advantage of Liberty's TOU rates with their own demand response devices. Liberty also seeks approval of several new time-of-use rates, including energy-only EV time of use rates,
