1 PROCEEDING 2 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Okay. Good 3 afternoon, everyone. I'm Commissioner Goldner. 4 I'm joined today by Commissioner Simpson and 5 Commissioner Chattopadhyay. 6 We're here in Docket DE 22-080, in 7 which the Commission will address New Hampshire 8 Electric Cooperative's Petition for Waiver of 9 Various Rules in Puc Chapter 2200. The Notice of 10 Adjudicative Proceeding in this docket lists 11 those requests by rule number and the duration of 12 the waiver requested on Pages 2 and 3. Some of 13 these requests were only through December 2022. 14 So, we will certainly give NHEC an opportunity to 15 update the Commission on the status of its 16 request, and to identify any requests that no 17 longer need to be addressed. 18 First, let's take appearances, 19 beginning with NHEC. 20 MR. PATCH: Good afternoon, 21 Commissioners. Doug Patch, with Orr & Reno. And 2.2 with me at the table today is Jeremy Clark. He's 23 the Financial Planning Analysis and Rates Manager 24 at the Co-op.

1 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Thank you. Very 2 good. 3 And let's move to the Department of 4 Energy. 5 MS. SCHWARZER: Good morning, Mr. 6 Chairman. My name is Mary Schwarzer. I'm A 7 Hearings Examiner/Staff Attorney with the 8 Department of Energy. With me today is Amanda 9 Noonan, Director of Consumer Affairs, and Scott 10 Balise, who is a Utility Analyst. 11 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Very good. Thank 12 you. And let's move to CPCNH. 13 14 MR. BELOW: Good afternoon, Commissioners. Clifton Below, I'm Chair of the 15 16 Board of Directors of the Community Power 17 Coalition, on behalf of the Coalition. 18 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Very good. And is 19 Colonial Power Group here today? 20 MR. ORMSBEE: Yes, sir. Stuart 21 Ormsbee, Vice President with Colonial Power 2.2 Group. 23 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Okay. Welcome, Mr. 24 Ormsbee.

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1 So, for preliminary matters, at the 2 outset, CPCNH submitted a timely Petition to 3 Intervene, which was not objected to. Does 4 anyone have anything further to say with respect 5 to CPCNH's Petition to Intervene? 6 [No verbal response.] 7 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Seeing none. So, we reviewed and determined that CPCNH's intervention 8 would be in the interest of justice, and would 9 10 not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of 11 these proceedings, and therefore grant 12 intervention pursuant to Puc 203.17 and RSA 13 541-A:32, II. 14 Next, Colonial Power Group submitted a Petition to Intervene after the deadline. 15 Are 16 there any objections to this Petition to 17 Intervene or other comments on it? 18 [No verbal response.] 19 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Okay. So, seeing 20 The Commission has reviewed it, and none. 21 determined that Colonial Power Group's 2.2 intervention would be in the interest of justice, 23 and would not impair the orderly and prompt 24 conduct of the proceedings, and therefore grants

1 prevention pursuant to Puc 203.17 and RSA 2 541-A:32, II. 3 Are there any other matters that need 4 to be raised before we take preliminary 5 positions? 6 [No verbal response.] 7 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Okay. Seeing none. Let's turn to the Petition, where we'll hear from 8 NHEC first, with a summary of its request and any 9 10 potential updates, and then hear from other 11 parties. Mr. Patch. 12 MR. PATCH: Thank you. 13 I mean, our request I think is pretty 14 straightforward. There are some of the dates 15 that we had provided in the Petition of 16 December 31st of 2022, which have since come and 17 gone. And some of those, and I could ask Mr. 18 Clark to give you more detail, if you wanted it, 19 but some of those, you know, they're in good 20 shape on. There may be a couple that they're 21 still working on. And that, at this point in 2.2 time, I'm not sure that it makes a huge 23 difference on those, because I don't know that 24 anybody is actually ready to be able to take

advantage of it.

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2 But we've had some discussions, too, 3 just so you know, in terms of a procedural 4 schedule with the other parties. And we're still 5 working on that. But I don't see any difficulty 6 with coming up with something that, you know, may 7 even result in just a recommendation to the Commission, possibly not the need for a hearing. 8 But, anyway, that's still under 9 discussion, and we've exchanged some emails about 10 11 that. 12 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Okay. Thank you, 13 Mr. Patch. 14 Let's move to the Department of Energy. 15 MS. SCHWARZER: Thank you, Mr. 16 Chairman. 17 With regard to NHEC, the Department is 18 mindful that there's a special provision in the 19 rules, 2201.03(b), which alters the standard of 20 review somewhat from the standard waiver 21 provisions. 2.2 It's likely that the waivers requested, 23 pending software changes to be made December 24 31st, 2022, are moot. And we expect some

1 discovery in this docket will explore whether 2 those changes have been made timely, and they 3 resulted in the utility's ability to obtain 4 information. 5 We expect this docket to focus on the 6 other waivers requested, and what compliance with 7 the rule requires, as to whether the -- what 8 value the missing information would provide, and whether the missing information is mission 9 10 critical. 11 We want to ascertain whether, once the 12 POR plans are in effect, missing information will 13 indeed be relevant. And we look forward to doing 14 that with NHEC and the other parties to this 15 docket. 16 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Thank you, Attorney 17 Schwarzer. 18 Let's move to CPCNH. 19 MR. BELOW: Thank you. 20 In general, we understand the Co-op's 21 need for some of these, some, if not all, the 2.2 rule waivers. I think there's one or two of them 23 that we'll want to discuss with them, whether 24 they need to be fully waived or whether there is

1 a way to partially meet the intention of the 2 rules. But we're happy to work with the Co-op 3 and DOE and Colonial Power to sort things out. 4 Thank you. 5 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Thank you, Mr. 6 Below. 7 And the Colonial Power Group? MR. ORMSBEE: Yes. 8 I mean, briefly, you know, Colonial is 9 10 actually guite encouraged with the work that the 11 Co-op has undertaken already, based on some 12 preliminary conversations that Mr. Patch 13 alluded -- touched on. 14 You know, the devils are going to be in 15 the details, in terms of getting some of the core 16 information available for programs to launch 17 successfully. We haven't quite gotten into all 18 those details. But I know, you know, 19 conversations will continue. So, I'm encouraged 20 by the process so far. 21 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Very good. Thank 2.2 you, Mr. Ormsbee. 23 Let's move now to Commissioner 24 questions, beginning with Commissioner Simpson?

1 CMSR. SIMPSON: Thank you, Mr. 2 Chairman. I don't have any questions. 3 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Very good. And 4 Commissioner Chattopadhyay? 5 CMSR. CHATTOPADHYAY: A very quick one. 6 Can you update me on where the POR 7 Program is right now? Like, is it -- what's the status of it? 8 Thank you, Commissioner. 9 MR. CLARK: 10 We are currently working on a proposal. 11 And we expect to have a proposal filed before the 12 March 21st date. 13 CMSR. CHATTOPADHYAY: Thank you. That's all I have. 14 15 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Okay. Any other 16 questions? 17 [No verbal response.] 18 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: No. I'm sorry. 19 Okay. So, do the parties have any 20 comments for the Commission on establishing a 21 procedural schedule to govern the remaining of 2.2 this proceeding? Or, would you prefer to discuss 23 this in technical session and get back to the 24 Commission with a proposal?

1 (Multiple parties indicating in the 2 affirmative.) 3 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: The latter it looks like. 4 5 MR. PATCH: Yes. 6 MS. SCHWARZER: Yes. 7 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Thank you. For the stenographer, there were a lot of nodding of 8 9 heads out there. 10 Okay. Is there anything else we need 11 to discuss today, before you move to technical session? 12 13 [No verbal response.] CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Okay. A new world 14 record: Seven minutes. 15 16 [Laughter.] 17 CHAIRMAN GOLDNER: Thank you, everyone. 18 We are adjourned. (Whereupon the prehearing conference 19 was adjourned at 1:38 p.m., and a 20 technical session was held thereafter.) 21 2.2 23 24
