## RE: DE 23-038 – Town of Hampton Notification of Community Power Aggregation Program Commencement of Service

Dear Chairman Goldner,

I submit this letter on behalf of the Town of Hampton to notify the Commission that the Town of Hampton will be commencing electricity supply service for its Community Power Aggregation Program ("Program") effective with electricity consumers' May 2024 meter read dates. Consistent with Hampton's CPA Plan as approved by the Commission on May 6, 2023, Hampton will be operating its Program on an opt-out basis. This notice is being provided pursuant to 2204.04(b)(2) wherein the commencement of service will be occurring after the first two months of the utility default service period. Hampton is served almost entirely by Unitil, with a very small number of consumers (approximately 15) served by Eversource.
