## Before the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission

I request that Attorney Wiesner recuse himself from this proceeding given his many years as a member of the PUC/DOE and thus emotional influence on the members of the PUC/DOE, as a former member of their groups. The list of those coming to the PUC from industry (Michael Harrington and Tom Getz for example) and those going from the PUC to industry (Tom Getz, and Susan Geiger, for example) indicates corporations are buying influence over the regulatory process. This problem exists in other N.H. Agencies: During Northern Pass Eversource hired Mark Hodgdon (DOT), Tom Getz (PUC), Dana Bisbee (SEC) and Robert Varney (DES) to represent Eversource/Hydro-Quebec before the SEC.

I request that at least one person on the DOE group rendering the opinion requested in the procedural order be off-the-grid. It is not to be expected that clients of the dealer on whom they are completely dependent for a product (electricity) will make objective decisions about issues involving that dealer or "reasonable need" for the product.

The audit divisions of the PUC/DOE have authority to audit Eversource's claimed construction costs for the Asset Condition projects, and I request that they do so, if that was not understood to be included in my petition.
