My name is Susan Gove and I reside in a one-bedroom apartment on the west side of Manchester. My residence began March 1st of this year, and my heat and hot water are supplied by Liberty Utilities. I receive widow's benefits from Social Security, as well as working full-time for a company in Goffstown, I am 68 years old, and could apply for disability due to back pain, but I am too proud for that.

Liberty Utilities is looking for a rate increase to begin October 1, 2023. I am not a whiz on the economy, but I know I am against a rate increase for this company. On June 27th, I wrote an email to Liberty, asking them why my bill was \$88.00 and change when I am the only one occupying the residence and I take a shower every other day and have had my heat turned OFF for two months. You see, my apartment is on the first floor and just above the burners for all the apartment here - it generates enough heat to keep me warm. I am also out of the house all day at work. I received an automated email response the next day, saying they had received my query. I had also requested, in my email, that they test my meter to make sure it is accurate. I am here to report that as of today, I have received no response.

This is the perfect example of how big companies treat little people. I asked for assistance within their realm and I have heard nothing. I beg you NOT to allow the increase that Liberty Utilities is asking for. People on fixed incomes cannot afford a rate increase. I am working and cannot afford the current rate, never mind a rate hike. I am asking you to seriously consider what I have written here, Where do the rate hikes stop?
