Re: DE 21-078, Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy Petition for Electric Vehicle Make-Ready and Demand Charge Alternative Proposals Procedural Schedule and Intervention Requests

To the Parties:

On August 25, 2021, the Commission held a duly noticed prehearing conference in the above-referenced matter. Appearances were entered by Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy (Eversource) and the Department of Energy (Energy). Also present were the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Resources (DES), Clean Energy NH (CENH), Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), and ChargePoint, Inc. (ChargePoint), which have filed petitions to intervene. The Town of Derry also filed a petition to intervene. The Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA) filed a letter of participation, but did not appear at the prehearing conference.

No objections to any of the foregoing intervention requests were filed. Accordingly, the petitions to intervene filed by DES, CENH, CLF, ChargePoint, and the Town of Derry are granted, based on a finding that the standard for intervention in RSA 541-A:32 has been met. *See* N.H. Admin. R., Puc 203.17.

Following the prehearing conference, Eversource, DES, CENH, CLF, ChargePoint, and Energy agreed upon the following proposed schedule, which Energy submitted to the Commission by letter dated August 26, 2021:
