

Dear Ms. Howland:



Staff and the Parties also established that the McLane law firm, representing Pennichuck, will maintain a data room at Pennichuck's offices in Merrimack. The data room will be generally available during normal business hours.

As for discovery, the Staff and Parties agreed to conduct discovery by electronic means. Staff will research whether some discovery documents, such as large documents, can additionally be located on the Commission's web site. The only exception to electronic discovery is intervenor Claire McHugh. To facilitate and streamline Nashua and Pennichuck's process, Staff offered to supply Ms. McHugh with hard copies of all information disseminated in discovery. While Staff is printing off hard copies for Staff, Staff will simply print an extra copy and mail it to Ms. McHugh. This is not a normal accommodation, however, Staff felt it the best solution given the time pressure Nashua and Pennichuck will be under to complete full discovery.

Documents that are deemed confidential will not be sent electronically and Staff and the Parties believed the present system outlined in the statutes and Commission rules regarding providing confidential treatment of documents would be suitable in this proceeding. As a reminder of the Commission's rules, Staff disseminated a complete copy of Puc 200 to the parties in this docket.

Regarding objections to discovery, Staff and the Parties respectfully ask the Commission to waive application of Puc 204.04 (b) which requires objections to data requests be served in

writing on the propounder of the requests within 4 days following receipt of the request. Staff and the Parties request the deadline be extended to 10 days, rather than 4 days. Staff and the Parties believe the complexity of the subject matter in this proceeding necessitates extending the deadline and that this extension is not onerous. Staff and the Parties believe that the time extension will not disrupt the orderly proceeding of this docket, rather, it will facilitate it. The extension serves the public interest in that it allows parties more time to access the material sought and minimizes perhaps hasty decisions on the eve of the four-day deadline as to whether an objection is needed. The extension satisfies the intent of the rule that discovery objections be made in a timely manner. For these reasons, Staff and the Parties ask that the Commission waive Puc 204.04 (b) and allow a 10 day response time.
