RE: Docket No. 06-067, Bay Ring Petition for Investigation into Verizon New Hampshire's Practice of Imposing Access Charges, Including Carrier Common Line (CCL) Access Charges, on Calls Which Originate on BayRing's Network and Terminate on Wireless Carriers' Networks

Dear Ms. Howland:

It has come to my attention that the two exhibits referenced in AT&T's brief filed today were inadvertently omitted from the filing package. Enclosed please find Exhibits A and B, as referenced in AT&T's Phase 2 Brief.

In addition, we inadvertently omitted from AT&T's calculation of disputed charges AT&T's response to the request in Staff Attorney Fabrizio's November 5, 2008, letter that "carriers will determine whether additional minutes need to be counted for termination of certain wireless calls and whether a dispute with FairPoint over these charges exists." AT&T's response is as follows:

Additional Minutes For The Termination Of Certain Wireless Calls. The discrepancy between local switching minutes (LS MOUs) and carrier common line minutes (CCL MOUs) will not capture any unlawful CCL charges that Verizon applied when calls are terminated to wireless carriers over Type I interconnection arrangements, because Verizon's switch will have performed the switching function. For precisely this reason, Verizon has the information necessary to determine whether there were any MOUs that were terminated over Type I arrangements and, if so, the number of such MOUs over the reparations period. AT&T would have no way to know. Therefore, Verizon must provide that information.

Dispute with FairPoint. AT&T's dispute with FairPoint regarding the calculation of disputed amounts has been, or will be, resolved outside of this proceeding.
