# AMENDED ESTIMATED REFUND DUE TO SPRINT

Sprint Communications Company, L.P. and Sprint Spectrum L.P. (collectively "Sprint"), respectfully submits this Amended Estimated Refund Due to Sprint ("Amended Estimate") in the above-captioned proceeding. The originally filed estimate was timely submitted as per the schedule announced at the November 5, 2008 technical session and memorialized in a November 5, 2008 letter filed with the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") by Commission staff.

Following its initial submission, Sprint continued to work with Verizon to address differences in the parties' calculations. The result is that the parties' calculations in the Amended Estimate are nearly identical. The only differences between the parties' calculations can be attributed to differences in rounding the monthly totals. Additionally, Sprint had initially attributed one 2008 payment (listed as March 2008 on Sprint's spreadsheet) to Verizon as its payment was made to Verizon. Verizon asserts that this payment was transferred to Fairpoint pursuant to an agreement between Verizon and Fairpoint. Sprint has moved this payment from the Verizon spreadsheet to the Fairpoint spreadsheet to match the Verizon calculations. Sprint does not release Verizon from Sprint's claim for this amount, but will do so in the event the Commission agrees with Verizon's assertion that this portion of the claim is in fact due from Fairpoint.

The spreadsheet attached as Exhibit 1 contains a calculation of Sprint's claim against Verizon. The spreadsheet contains four separate calculations at different interest rates. These interest rates reflect the interest rates articulated by the various parties in their pleadings in this docket (interest rates under RSA 336.1-I, RSA 336.1-II, cost of capitol, and tariffed rate).

The spreadsheet attached as Exhibit 2 contains a calculation of the amount Fairpoint owes Sprint. The spreadsheet lists two months of payments (April and March 2008). Sprint is unaware of the party (Verizon or Fairpoint) from whom these payments are due, and relies on the Commission to ascertain the liable party. The spreadsheet contains four separate calculations at different interest rates. These interest rates reflect the interest rates articulated by the various parties in their pleadings in this docket (interest rates under RSA 336.1-I, RSA 336.1-II, cost of capitol, and tariffed rate).

Sprint requests that Exhibits 1 and 2 be treated confidentially pursuant to R.S.A. § 365:43. The information contained in Exhibits 1 and 2 is not publicly available, not published elsewhere, is subject to measures intended to prevent its release or dissemination outside the company, is available only to a limited number of employees of the company, and pertains to the provision of competitive services within New Hampshire.
