Dear Ms. Howland,

On March 13, 2008, the Public Utilities Commission requested comments from intervenors and other parties concerning the above-referenced docket. The Campaign for Ratepayers Rights (CRR), an intervenor in this docket submits the following comments for consideration by the Commission.

CRR agrees with the comments submitted by intervenor Conservation Law Foundation (CLF). Energy efficiency is the least expensive form of energy and greater incentives are necessary in order to promote efficiency efforts. Though CRR is prepared to join with other stakeholders in supporting revenue decoupling as a means to achieve increased efficiency, CRR believes that significant attention must be given to additional measures of promoting efficiency as well. Decoupling the current rate system will remove the disincentive to efficiency; however, it is in the design of additional measures to promote efficiency, through DSM or direct incentives, that the interests of consumers are best served.

CRR appreciates the opportunity to comment on this issue and looks forward to working with other parties in the docket to serve the best interests of ratepayers. Thank you for your consideration.
