On August 29, 2008, Aquarion Water Company of New Hampshire filed a request with the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission to increase its rates. Aquarion states that the higher rates, shown in the table below, are needed to help recover, among other things, investments in water utility infrastructure such as source of supply improvements and main replacements. On a temporary basis, Aquarion has requested an overall increase to its rates of 12.83%. The permanent rates proposed by Aquarion would result in an overall average increase of 21.08% in total. The typical 5/8 inch metered residential customer would see a temporary increase of 12.97% and a permanent rate increase of 18.88% in total. In addition, the Company has requested an additional increase of approximately 4.44% as a step adjustment for a significant plan addition currently under construction, proposed a change to its rate design to encourage conservation, requested a surcharge for eligible source of supply improvements, and proposed conservation measures for new developments.
