Dear Ms. Howland:

By this letter, DIECA Communications, Inc. d/b/a Covad Communications Company ("Covad") concurs with and supports the Motions to Dismiss filed by One Communications ("One"), CRC Communications of Maine, Inc. ("CRC"), and Freedom Ring Communications d/b/a Bayring Communications ("Bayring") regarding FairPoint Communications' supplemental and revised petition. While Covad urges the Commission to grant the Motions to Dismiss, Covad also supports the alternative remedies to stay the proceedings to allow FairPoint and affected CLECs to negotiate and to finalize a streamlined PAP as contemplated by earlier Commission orders and agreements.

Finally, Covad supports One's, CRC's, and Bayring's position that any revision to the PAP should not and cannot be applied retroactively. Covad urges the Commission to deny FairPoint's revised petition on this issue now, even if the Commission stays the petition while the PAP is worked out in a collaborative. Without such action now, the PAP remedy payments/credits to CLECs will be at risk and cause unneeded and unnecessary uncertainty as to the treatment of those credits.
