supplemental Agreement Agreement for the 2010 Core Energy Efficiency Programs ("Core programs"), the Commission noted that the New Hampshire Legislature was considering legislation. Senate Bill 300, that would expand coverage of the low income Electric Assistance Program (EAP) by shifting a portion of the System Benefits Charge (SBC) funds from energy efficiency to the EAP. On January 14, 2010, Senate Bill 300 was signed into law effective January 14, 2010 Accordingly, the Commission directed National Ciril, New Hampshire Electric Cooperative, inc., Public Service Company of New Hampshire and Unitil Energy Systems, inc. In Order No. 25,062, the Commission also determined that, in the event SB 300 was enacted, a second phase of this proceeding would be conducted to address the impact on the Core programs from the shift in funds. The Commission directed interested parties and Staff to immediately reconverte to determine how to address the reduction in Core program funding. Options to be considered include implementing a pro-rata reduction across the board for all Core programs, reducing funding on a program-by-program basis, and allocating funds from the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction Fund to support the planned 2010 Core programs producing funding on a program by program should be filed. See, Order No. 24,062 at 20.

The Commission directs the utilities to file recommendations should be filed. See, Order No. 24,062 at 20.

The Commission directs the utilities to file recommendations and any proposed budget revisions for the 2010 Core energy efficiency programs based on the changed allocation no later than February 12, 2010 and that interested parties and Staff hold a technical session on February 12, 2010 and that interested parties and Staff hold a technical session on February 12, 2010 to review the proposals.
