Dear Ms. Howland:

I am submitting an original and six copies of the report of New England Power Company d/b/a National Grid ("NEP") on the reconciliation of Contract Termination Charges ("CTC") to Granite State Electric Company d/b/a National Grid ("Granite State").

In the report, NEP has reconciled the costs and revenues under its CTC formula during the period from October 1, 2008 through September 30, 2009. As shown in the report, the reconciliation would change the CTC rate in effect in 2010 from the current rate of (0.01) cents per kWh, as reflected in the Reconciliation Report dated November 26, 2008, to 0.07 cents per kWh.


NEP's and Granite State's adjustments to the CTC are subject to the dispute resolution procedure set forth in Section 3.5 of the Wholesale Restructuring Settlement. In the event that an adjustment is required, NEP and Granite State will reflect the adjustment in the CTC Reconciliation Account, together with a return, and that adjustment will then be incorporated into future CTC filings.
