Re: Docket 09-255; Application for Independent Monitor Status; Independent Monitor's Annual Production Reports for Customer-Sited New Hampshire RPS Certificate Facilities

Dear Ms. Howland,

Enclosed, but under separate individual cover, please find the annual production reports for three customer-sited facilities that were qualified by the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission to produce either Class I or Class II renewable energy certificates.¹

As of year-end 2015, the revenue grade metering systems were deemed to be present and in good-working order.

The two facilities covered in these reports are:

- Spaulding Pond Hydro (Docket #DE12-210)
- Weston Dam Solar (Docket #DE14-055)
- Monadnock Paper Company (Docket #DE13-318)

Looking forward, I believe that the Commission should consider a way to automate this reporting for behind-the-meter generation qualified for the New Hampshire RPS by using the NEPOOL GIS. Over time, the number of behind-the-meter generators will grow exponentially. By automating this manual reporting, it may be possible to get better, more current reporting from such generators while at the same time getting a custom report tailored to the specific needs
