Dear Ms. Hamilton:

On June 2, 2010, the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (Commission) received an application from Conservation Services Group on behalf of Princeton Crossing L. P. (Princeton Crossing) requesting certification for the Princeton Properties photovoltaic facility as a Class II renewable energy source pursuant to RSA 362-F, New Hampshire's Renewable Portfolio Standard law. Staff has reviewed your application and has noted the following items that must be addressed before your application is considered complete:

- 1.) Section II of your application identifies one 3,524 kilowatt (kW) photovoltaic facility located at 12 Heritage Drive, Salem, Massachusetts. However, the interconnection agreement lists 17 facilities, one of which is a 3.84 kW facility that is also located at 12 Heritage Drive, Salem Massachusetts. Does Princeton Crossing wish to certify only one facility or all 17 facilities listed in the interconnection agreement? If Princeton Crossing wants to certify all of the facilities, does it also request aggregator status pursuant to N.H. Code of Administrative Rules Puc 2506?
- 2.) Attachment 1 of the interconnection agreement states that Massachusetts Electric Company (MEC) will install new bidirectional power flow meters at each

- location. Has MEC installed all of these meters? If so, please provide each facility's meter installation date.
- 3.) Have these facilities and the resulting aggregation been certified to receive renewable energy certificates under another state's renewable portfolio standard program? If so, please provide support.
- 4.) Attachment 2 of the interconnection agreement states that MEC will temporarily shut down the facilities before June 1, 2010 to test the anti-islanding protection of the inverters. Has MEC completed such tests?

These items must be received by the Commission to complete your application. Until such time as your application is complete, it will not be processed. If the requested documentation is not provided within ten business days, your file will be closed without prejudice.
