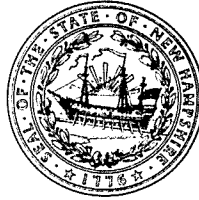

Dear Ms. Steward:

On September 14, 2010, Soltage MGTCO, LLC filed an application on behalf of Saint Luke's Lifeworks requesting that the Commission grant approval for its customer-sited photovoltaic facility (Saint Luke's facility) to produce Class II renewable energy certificates pursuant to RSA 362-F, New Hampshire's Renewable Portfolio Standard law. On October 13, 2010, Staff sent you a deficiency letter to which you did not formally respond. After a series of telephone conversations with Soltage, Staff learned you were not able to acquire the necessary documentation to complete your application pursuant to the N.H. Code of Administrative Rule Puc 2505.08. Then, on February 3, 2011, you filed a letter on behalf of Soltage stating that you will not be pursuing Class II renewable energy source eligibility for the Saint Luke's facility with the State of New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission.

The Commission considers your application withdrawn and has closed the above referenced docket without prejudice.
