

Re: DM 10-302, Notification of Northeast Energy Partners, LLC's Intent to Provide Electric Aggregation Service

Dear Ms. DiMare:

This is to confirm that the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (Commission) has received Northeast Energy Partners, LLC d/b/a National Energy Partners' (NEP)'s notice of intent to provide electric aggregation service in the State of New Hampshire, pursuant to New Hampshire Administrative Rules Puc 2003.05. Staff has reviewed the application provided and believes that it meets the requirements of Puc 2003.05. Based on Staff's recommendation and the Commission's review, the Commission approves NEP's application to provide electric aggregation service in New Hampshire.

Please note the following provision of Puc 2003.05 (f): "[E]ach approved aggregator shall re-notify the commission after the initial 2 year period, or after the 5 year renewal period as applicable, by filing with the commission an application for renewal at least 60 days prior to the expiration of the currently effective registration." NEP's original notice anniversary date is February 9, 2007 and therefore it is required to refile an up-to-date written notice on or before **December 12, 2015** if it continues to offer and provide electric aggregation service. In addition, NEP is subject to the provisions of Puc 2004.03, telephone solicitation of customers, and Puc 2004.08, customer protections provided by aggregators.
