National Grid filed supporting testimony and related schedules including draft tariff pages.

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National Grid said that outdoor lighting customers can select the Part-Night Option service for any new light installations or request to change the mode of operation for all or some of the customer's existing street lights. The tariff provides that the cost of the service and related expenses would be borne by the customer. National Grid said that the cost of the service to change to part night hours is \$150.00 per light. The related expenses, which would also be paid by the customer, include work zone protection, traffic control and permit fees.

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Under the proposed tariff, billing changes would become effected in the next bill cycle. National Grid stated that the billing associated with the energy usage under the Part-Night Option would be less than for full night service due to the reduced hours of operation. According to the Company, the billing impact for the energy based charges would be based upon 2,448 hours of operation annually for the part-night operation as compared to the 4,175 annual for full-night service street lighting. The actual energy cost savings would depend on the individual lamp type wattage and light fixture type. The Company said that it proposes to revise the existing Rate M tariff to clarify that the State, municipalities and other public entity customers as well as installations on tunnels and bridges would be eligible to elect the Part-Night Option.
