### ORDER OF NOTICE

On July 28, 2011, the Commission voted pursuant to RSA 541-A to initiate a rulemaking for N.H. Code Admin. Rules, Puc 201.05, Waiver of Rules. The amendment clarifies that the Commission may seek waivers of Commission rules on its own motion.

A rulemaking notice form (Notice), as required by RSA 541-A:6, was filed with the Office of Legislative Services on August 15, 2011. The Notice sets forth a date for a public hearing to be held at the Commission and a deadline for the submission of written comments. That notice is appended hereto.

A copy of the Rulemaking Notice will be sent to all regulated utilities and to those parties previously requesting notice of rulemakings. Pursuant to RSA 541-A:6, III, notice will also be provided by public notice advertisement in a publication of daily statewide circulation.

**ORDERED**, that a Public Hearing, pursuant to RSA 541-A:11, be held before the Commission located at 21 South Fruit Street, Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire, on September

20, 2011 at 10:00 a.m., and that the deadline for submission of materials in writing or via e-mail shall be October 3, 2011, as set forth in the Notice; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to RSA 541-A:6, III, the Commission shall undertake a public notice advertisement by publishing a copy of this Order together with the Notice no later than September 1, 2011, in a newspaper with a daily statewide circulation, publication to be documented by affidavit filed with the Commission on or before September 26, 2011.
