UNION TELEPHONE COMPANY Petition for an Alternative Form of Regulation

ORDER OF NOTICE

On February 4, 2011, Union Telephone Company (Union) filed a Petition for an Alternative Form of Regulation pursuant to RSA 374:3-b with the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission (Commission). The petition and subsequent docket filings, other than information for which confidential treatment is requested of or granted by the Commission, will be posted to the Commission's website at http://www.puc.nh.gov/Regulatory/Docketbis.l2011/11 024.html.

Union is a rural incumbent local exchange carrier providing telephone services in Alton, Barnstead, Center Barnstead, Gilmanton Iron Works and New Durham, New Hampshire. It is a wholly-owned subsidiary of TDS Communications Corporation and serves fewer than 25,000 access lines in New Hampshire. Pursuant to ASA 374:3-b, Union seeks Commission approval of its plan for alternative regulation that would permit it to be regulated in a manner more comparable to competitive local exchange carriers in New Hampshire. According to its pention. Union is facing competitive pressures from other carriers operating in its service territories, specifically, MetroCast Cablevision of New Hampshire, LLC (MetroCast) and IDT America Corp. (IDT), and is in need of an alternative form of regulation to remain

The filing raises, inter alia, issues related to whether the requirements of RSA 374:3-b. which requires the Commission to consider: (1) whether competitive wireline, wireless or preachand service is available to a majority of retail customers in each exchange; (2) that the plan provides for maximum basic local service rates; (3) if the plan promotes innovative telecommunications services; (4) if the plan meets inter-carrier service obligations; and (5) whether the plan preserves universal access to affordable basic telephone service, are met; whather Union's plan for alternative regulation is otherwise just and reasonable. Each party has the notif to have an afformey represent the party at the party's own expense.

Based upon the foregoing, it is hereby

ORDERED, that a Prehearing Conference, pursuant to N.H. Code Admir. Rules Puc 203,15, be held before the Commission located at 21 S. Fruit St., Suite 10, Concord, New Hampshire on March 1, 2011 at 10:00 a.m., at which each party will provide a preliminary statement of its position with regard to the petition and any of the issues set forth in N.H. Code Admin. Rules Pub 203.15 shall be considered; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that, immediately following the Prehearing Conference, Union, the Staff of the Commission and any Intervenors hold a Technical Session to review the petition and allow Union to provide any amendments or updates to its filling; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to N.H. Code Admin. Rules Puc 203.12, Union shall notify all persons desiring to be heard at this hearing by publishing a copy of this Order of Notice no later than February 18, 2011, in a newspaper with general circulation in those partions of the state in which operations are conducted, publication to be documented by affidavit filed with the Commission on or before March 1, 2011; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to N.H. Code Admin, Rules Puc 203.17, any party seaking to intervene in the proceeding shall submit to the Commission seven copies of Petition to Intervene with copies sent to Union and the Office of the Consumer Advocate on or before February 27, 2011, such Petition stating the facts demonstrating how its notifs, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interest may be affected by the proceeding, as required by N.H. Code Admin. Rule Pub 203.17 and RSA 541-A:32.I(b);

FURTHER ORDERED, that any party objecting to a Petilion to Intervene make said Objection on or before March 1, 2011
