Dear Secretary Howland:

On behalf of Unitil Energy Systems, Inc. ("UES"), enclosed are an original and six (6) copies of "UES Major Storm Cost Reserve Fund Report" for the 12 month period ending December 31, 2014. This filing complies with the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") requirements set forth in the Company's Rate Plan Settlement in Docket No. DE 10-055 and as ordered in Docket No. DE 11-277, Order No. 25,351, *Order Granting Increase to Storm Recovery Adjustment Factor* ("SRAF"), issued April 24, 2012 (requiring UES "to file annual reports on the Storm Reserve Fund and storm recovery updates for those storms where costs are recovered through the SRAF").

As described more fully in the Report, the Major Storm Cost Reserve ("MSCR") Fund Balance at December 31, 2014 is (\$1,011,180), and does not include costs associated with the November 27, 2014 Snow Event, preliminarily estimated at \$2 million. The Company is not proposing an adjustment to the level of annual MSCR recovery or seeking cost recovery for the November 27 Snow Event through its SRAF at this time, but will continue to review the recovery level on a going forward basis as it continues to incur costs for future storm events.

Please refer to the *UES MSCR Fund Reconciliation as of December 31, 2014* on page 4 of the Report for a summary of the costs. Please refer to the Storm Recovery Adjustment Factor Reconciliation which provides the reconciliation of the SRAF through December 31, 2014 on page 5 of the Report.

Please also note that the Winter Storm which occurred on December 22, 2013, described at pages 7-12 of the Report, did not meet the quantitative criteria for inclusion and recovery through the MSCR Fund. However, based on the confidence level of professional weather forecasters that significant icing would occur, the Company took action to prepare for the restoration of service to customers from this storm event. Since the Company prepared for the most likely scenario based on the predicted icing amounts, the Company hereby petitions the Commission to recover the costs of this

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storm through the MSCR. Support for this request is found within this section of the Report, and includes the New Hampshire Emergency Operations Center notification and Unitil's weather service provider forecast. Also attached is an affidavit of Richard Francazio, Director of Business Continuity and Compliance, Unitil Service Corp., under whose direction the Report was prepared.

Company representatives, including Mr. Francazio, are available to review the Report and respond to any questions, at the convenience of the Commission, Commission Staff and other interested parties.
