Dear Ms. Howland:

North American Power and Gas, LLC ("NAPG") hereby responds to the Motion to Close Docket Without Prejudice filed by Retail Energy Supply Association ("RESA" and "RESA Motion"). NAPG has not played a central role in supporting the market changes originally recommended by RESA that led the Public Utilities Commission to open the instant investigation. As such, NAPG has no cause to oppose, and supports, the RESA request to close the docket without prejudice pending additional developments.

NAPG notes that the procedural schedule deferred until hearing NAPG's opportunity to respond to PSNH pre-filed testimony, including Mr. Hall's testimony that an NAPG representative inaccurately claimed in a marketing call that PSNH energy prices would increase in July. (A recent Manchester Union Leader article reiterated Mr. Hall's claim.) NAPG had intended to advise the Commission and parties that the call transcript contradicts Mr. Hall's assertions. NAPG stands ready to substantiate its rebuttal in any appropriate forum.
