Staff responds here to Order No. 24,894, dated September 17, 2008, asking it to provide information describing all assessment report and annual report filings made by Global Naps, Inc. (Global Naps) with the Commission for the years 2004 through 2007 (page 9, paragraph 2).

Staff noted that the Order makes references to CLEC-2 and CLEC-3, the form identifiers for the assessment and annual reports, respectively. Staff would like to make clear that CLEC-2 and CLEC-3 first came into being under the current version of the Puc 400 rules, adopted May 10, 2005. Under the prior version of the rules CLECs were still required to file annual reports, but there was no provision requiring them to submit a separate assessment report and the Commission had no forms that were identified as CLEC-2 or CLEC-3. In summary, 2005 was the first calendar year for which a CLEC could file CLEC-2 and CLEC-3. Under the current rules, the frequency and deadline for filing each of the forms is as follows:

Puc 434.03 (a) Unless otherwise specified in this part, reports filed annually shall be due on or before March 31 of each year, and shall cover the most recent calendar year.

- (b) A CLEC shall file the following commission reports annually:
- (2) Form CLEC-2 Assessment Report, as described in Puc 449.03
- (3) Form CLEC-3 Annual Report, as described in Puc 449.04

Global Naps filed an annual report for 2004 and an assessment report for 2006. Copies of the 2004 annual report and the 2006 assessment report are shown in Exhibits A and B, respectively. The Commission has no record of Global Naps filing assessment reports (CLEC-2) for 2005 or 2007, nor annual reports (CLEC-3) for 2005, 2006, or 2007.
