Re: DE 12-210, Spaulding Ave Industrial Complex, LLC's Application for Additional Class I Eligibility for Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs) for the Spaulding Pond Hydroelectric Facility, Pursuant to RSA 362-F.

Dear Mr. Hickey:

On January 04, 2013, the PUC received a letter from Hydro Management requesting that we recognize RECs generated from electricity consumed behind the meter at the above referenced facility. According to the letter, this behind-the-meter generation asset is registered with the NEPOOL GIS under facility code NON35901.

On February 6, 2013, Staff received an extensive email from you outlining the case for why the Commission should accept this customer-sited generation source as eligible for Class I RECs under the New Hampshire Renewable Portfolio Standard, Chapter 362-F; this email was formalized in a letter received February 20, 2013. Staff reviewed this letter and requested additional information on April 01, 2013. Additional information including an application for recognition of the behind-the-meter electricity generated by Spaulding Pond Hydro for Class I REC eligibility was received on May 28, 2013.

Staff has reviewed the application and requests your clarification of the following:

- 1. Please confirm that all tenants at the Spaulding Ave Industrial Complex receive electric service on the customer side of the PSNH retail revenue meter. If unable to confirm, please explain.
- 2. Please confirm that none of the tenants receiving electric service behind-themeter at the Spaulding Ave Industrial Complex is a separately-metered retail customer of PSNH or any electric supplier other than Spaulding Ave Industrial Complex, LLC. If unable to confirm, please explain.

- 3. Please confirm that all lines providing electric service to tenants at the Spaulding Ave Industrial Complex are owned by Spaulding Ave Industrial Complex, LLC and not by PSNH or any other person, firm or entity. If unable to confirm, please explain.
- 4. Please confirm that none of the lines providing electric service to tenants at the Spaulding Ave Industrial Complex crosses a public street or right-of-way or other public land. If unable to confirm, please explain.
- 5. Please describe in detail the metering configuration for the behind-the-meter electric generation and usage at the Spaulding Ave Industrial Complex and provide a drawing or diagram illustrating this metering configuration.
- 6. Please describe in detail how these meters will be monitored and read in order to determine and report the behind-the-meter electric generation and usage at the Spaulding Ave Industrial Complex, net of any generation station service or parasitic load of the hydroelectric plant.

The Commission seeks to clarify these issues to ensure that the record supports a determination regarding Spaulding Ave Industrial's eligibility as a customer-sited source for behind-the-meter production of renewable energy certificates.
