On October 31, 2012, Aquarion filed its 2013 Water Infrastructure and Conservation Adjustment (WICA) filing. On November 7, 2012, Staff contacted the Town of Hampton, the Town of North Hampton, the Town of Rye, the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and Aquarion and proposed a procedural schedule for review of the filing. Aquarion, OCA, North Hampton, and Hampton have responded and have agreed to the schedule proposed by Staff. We have not heard from the Town of Rye; the Town has not participated in any of the WICA reviews in previous years. The following procedural schedule is presented for the Commission's consideration.
