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**Request:**

Reference response to OCA 1-3. The response appears to indicate that costs for NSTAR Electric & Gas Corporation are allocated to PSNH and included in the 2012 costs under review in this Docket. Please confirm if this is correct. If this is correct, please quantify all costs from NSTAR allocated to PSNH during 2012.

**Response:**

As part of the merger, services formerly provided to PSNH by NUSCO are now being provided by NUSCO and NSTAR Electric and Gas Corporation (the NSTAR service company). This was anticipated as part of the merger as functions are realigned and consolidated under the new leadership team. The plan is to merge NUSCO and the NSTAR service company into one entity in the near future. In the short term, PSNH will be provided services by both NUSCO and the NSTAR service company.

The NSTAR service company is, where appropriate, allocating a portion of its costs to legacy NU Companies. Included in the costs under review in this Docket are approximately \$900,000 that were allocated from the NSTAR service company.
