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PROCEEDING

CHAIRMAN IGNATIUS: Good afternoon. I'd like to open the hearing in Docket DW 13-128. This is Pittsfield Aqueduct Company's permanent rate case. Pittsfield filed on May 31st a request for increase to its permanent rates, and also seeking a waiver from certain filing provisions, which I had forgotten we had already granted in the order of notice. So, I won't go through that process again today. It also seeks temporary rates, although this isn't the temporary rate proceeding today.

The requested increase for permanent rates would be an increase of 63,000 -- almost \$64,000 in gross operating revenues, or a 9.34 percent increase effective July 1st, 2013. The temporary rate request asks for a 7 percent increase on a reconcilable basis. And, by order of notice dated June 20th, we called for a prehearing conference this afternoon and opportunity for interventions.

So, let's begin first with appearances.

       records, and that will be done in this proceeding or in

       conjunction with this proceeding. And, with the audit in

       mind, Staff and the parties will be developing a

       procedural schedule that incorporates knowledge of the
21
       findings of those, of the audit report, in time so that we
22
       can at least have one round of discovery after those
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in the audit, we can resolve them in this proceeding, or
