Dear Ms. Howland:

Enclosed for filing with the Commission please find an original and two (2) copies each of a clean and redlined version of page 111 of Unitil Energy System Inc.'s Electricity Delivery Tariff. This page outlines the Company's residential weatherization on bill financing ("OBF") initiative. The proposed changes include an emphasis on capping loans at \$2,000. The reason for the cap is that the NH CORE Electric Utilities have been granted approval for the 2015 program year to institute a third party financing initiative for loans above \$2,000. See Order No. 25,747 at pages 8, 13 and 14. In addition, Unitil requests flexibility to exceed the cap should circumstances arise for particular customers who cannot qualify for third party financing. In the event funds exist and it is in the best interest of the customers, the Company could raise its OBF cap to an amount above \$2,000, but not to exceed \$7,500, which is the amount reflected in the current tariff provisions.
