PORTSMOUTH - Seacoast business leaders share the optimism for job growth in the region that was forecast by a state Department of Employ-

Seacoast expected to lead N.H. job growth

PORTSMOUTH — Seacoast business leaders share the opinism for job growth in the region that was fore-cast by a state Department of Employment Security report.

The report — "New Hampshire Regional Planning Commissions Project Employment Growth, 2012-2022" — predicts that the Rockingham region will enjoy job growth of 14-7 percent, the highest of all line planning regions in the Granic State.

The region that includes the Seacoast, according to the report, will see the fastest employment growth in what it called heath care support occupations (26.8 percent), followed by computer and mathematical occupations (24.2 percent), health care practitioners and technical occupations (17.2 percent).

Doug Bates, president of the Greater Portsmouth Chamber of Commerce, and a number of factors contribute to the attractiveness of the state and this region to employers, among them the pull of the states natural resources and the consistently bigh ratings of livability for families.

"We have something that

Among the challenges he sees to maintain the kind of growth predicted by the report are the need for start-up manufacturing space, the need to maintain the infrastructure of roads and bridges to get goods to market, and whether new tax structures considered by state lawmakers will help or impede future economic growth.

He also cities the levaliza-
