Dear Director Howland:

On June 23, 2017 in the above-captioned proceeding, the Commission issued Order No. 26,029. That order established numerous requirements for utilities and others. Among those requirements was the following:

Because Eversource is in the process of divesting its generation assets and we anticipate it will be filing a general rate case within the next few years, we direct that Eversource perform a full marginal cost-of-service study within 12 months of the date of this Order, and make available to stakeholders in this proceeding the results of, and inputs to, that study as well as the methodology used in completing the study.

Order No. 26,029 at 61. Consistent with the Commission's directive, Eversource engaged a consultant who has performed a marginal cost of service study for Eversource. The study, while complete, is currently undergoing final review and refinement. To accommodate that necessary review, Eversource is intending to submit the completed study and related materials on or before July 16, 2018. Eversource submits that this short delay in the submission of the complete study will not prejudice any party or impede the work of the Commission or other stakeholders.
