1 PROCEEDING

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Good morning, everyone. We're here in Docket DG 17-104, which is a filing by Northern Utilities to change its delivery service terms and conditions related to the way it allocates certain expenses and allocations of capacity.

We're here for a prehearing conference. We know that there's a technical session scheduled immediately thereafter.

But, before we do anything else, let's take appearances.

Direct Energy Business Marketing, LLC.

         made to bring New Hampshire's delivery service

         terms and conditions into unity with the

         delivery service terms and conditions in Maine.
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         These primarily address issues related to
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         capacity assignment and the way that capacity
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         is assigned to customers in the State of New

         Hampshire.

         straightforward filing. It's something that
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         will enable the Company to move forward with --
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         in concert with its Maine Division. And we
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         look forward to working with the Staff, the
         OPA [OCA?], and the intervenors.

                   CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Mr. Patch.

                                Thank you. On behalf of
                   MR. PATCH:
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         Direct, I would say that, as a preliminary
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         position, they have some concerns with the
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terms and conditions, and the impact it will have on their business, on their customers, and on the market. They are hopeful that those concerns could be addressed in a cooperative way.

We understand that Northern is looking to have this docket come to a conclusion sometime in September. So, from a procedural perspective, Direct would like a procedure that would allow for perhaps a submission of some comments by Direct, and an opportunity to sit down with the Company and Staff and the OCA to see if they could work through those issues. That's something, obviously, we can talk about more during the technical session.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Mr. Kreis.

MR. KREIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. The OCA's interest, of course, is always in minimizing the extent to which one group of customers is subsidized by the residential utility customers that we represent. I understand the purpose of the Company's proposal to be, in addition to the uniformity

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that Mr. Taylor alluded to, to be reducing the extent to which there are any such cross subsidies. So, I think we anticipate resolving this docket rather quickly.

We're interested in hearing the concerns that Mr. Patch just promised to articulate. And we look forward to resolving the docket on the schedule contemplated by the Company.

CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Mr. Clifford.

MR. CLIFFORD: Staff is supportive in principle and appreciative of the Company keeping us informed with the proceedings in the State of Maine docket, which I believe has just been approved recently in the beginning of August is my understanding.

We've already issued our first set of data requests. The Company's responses came in last evening. And we're going to be reviewing those responses as soon as conveniently possible.

And we intend to develop our position based on our analysis of the information gathered during the proceedings. We don't take

1	any explicit position at this time, but we are
2	hopeful that Staff would be able to file a
3	recommendation or make a recommendation before
4	the requested effective date of November 1st.
5	And we also are interested in hearing from
6	Direct, through Mr. Patch, in the technical
7	session following.
8	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right. Is
9	there anything else we can do for you before we
10	leave you to your technical session?
11	[No verbal response.]
12	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right. With
13	that, we'll adjourn the prehearing conference.
14	Thank you all.

16	conference was adjourned at
17	10:11 a.m., and a technical
18	session was held thereafter.)
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
