





The NH Natural Heritage database has been checked for records of rare species and exemplary natural communities near the area mapped below. By this petition, which was filed June 23, 1941, the New Hampshire Electric Cooperative, Inc., a corporation duly organized under Laws of 1939, c. 212, seeks a license, pursuant to P. L. c. 244, ss. 8-11 to construct and maintain a marine cable transmission and distribution line under sections of Lake Winnipesaukee, a public water, in the Towns of Meredith and Gilford.

At the hearing on the petition, held in Concord on July 9, 1941, it was represented that the cable crossing is necessary to provide electric service to prospective users on Bear Island and Mark Island. It is proposed to lay the cable from Meredith Neck to Bear Island, both in the Town of

Meredith; thence from Bear Island to Mark Island in the Town of Gilford, furnishing electric service to over 30 customers on Bear Island and to three customers on Mark Island. Shore line property easements have been obtained by the petitioner from owners at each point of crossing.

Upon consideration of the evidence submitted we are satisfied that the license petitioned for may be exercised without substantially affecting the public rights in the waters concerned, and that the construction proposed is necessary to meet the reasonable requirements of service to the public. Our order will issue accordingly.


UNDERGROUND PRIMARY RADIAL FEED PRIMARY POLE MATERIALS IUSUB
