
Pandemic Response Plan

- Pandemic Response Team






Evolving Response




- Promote hygiene best practices

- Encourage remote work
- Increased facility cleaning
- Suspend disconnections / late fees
- Enact operations specific policies
 - Separate vehicles
 - Social distancing
 - Avoid entering NHEC facilities
 - Face coverings
- Suspend activities in member premises
- Mandatory work from home
- Member assistance outreach
- Face coverings / PPE
- Daily symptom / temperature certification
