In compliance with Order No. 26-604, dated April 7, 2022 in the above referenced docket, please find clean and redlined copies of the following tariffs pages, for effect July 1, 2022.

NHPUC No. 3 – Electricity Delivery, Unitil Energy Systems, Inc.

- Schedule TOU-EV-G2, Original Pages 58-A through 58-D
- Schedule TOU-EV-G1, Original Pages 58-E through 58- H

In support of these tariffs, please find the Electric Vehicle ("EV") rate development providing the calculation of the EV rates. As shown, consistent with the Settlement Agreement approved in this proceeding, the EV rates for distribution, transmission and generation are derived from the ratios resulting from the initial peak, mid peak, and offpeak rates for the summer and winter seasons which were provided in DE 20-170 Exhibit 24 Revised, Attachment A Illustrative Rates.

On this same day, under separate cover in Docket DE 22-026, which is the Company's Step Adjustment filing for effect July 1, 2022, the Company is filing its summary of rates for delivery service and a new tariff page summarizing the rates for its domestic whole house time of use rate (Schedule TOU-D) and incorporating the EV rates for domestic and general service. Since the distribution rates for Schedule TOU-D and the EV schedules above are based off the distribution rates that include the step adjustment, the distribution rates presented herein are also pending approval of the step adjustment.
