Introduction

Aquarion Water Company of New Hampshire, Inc. (Aquarion) has been participating in the annual Water Infrastructure and Conservation Adjustment (WICA) since the Commission approved it as a pilot program by Order 25,019 issued on September 25, 2009 in docket DW 08-098. The WICA program was extended and modified by Order 25,539 issued June 28, 2013 in docket DW 12-085.

On October 15, 2018, Aquarion filed the October 1, 2017 – September 30, 2018 costs to be considered for recovery through the WICA surcharge, which is petitioned for implementation January 1, 2019.

Projects Approved for 10/1/2017 through 9/30/2018

In Docket DW 17-154, Aquarion petitioned for approval of its proposed 2018 projects to be eligible for recovery though the WICA surcharge mechanism. Order 26,094, issued December 29, 2017, approved a WICA surcharge of 7.08 percent, approved the planned 2018 WICA projects, and preliminarily approved the 2019 projects.

By letters to the Commission, the Company adjusted the proposed 2018 projects as follows:

Aquarion provided several schedules within the filing which fulfill the requirements for continuing property records. Within DS-1, Audit was able to verify the reported Mill Road-Atlantic Ave to Pine Road, North Hampton main replacement value of \$1,045,877, the associated retirements of \$91,840, with the asset set to depreciate at a rate of 1.20%, with ½ year convention applied to both the addition and the retirement.

Retirements

Filing schedule Attachment DS-1, page 3 of 3, notes the Mill Road project had \$91,839.77 of eligible asset retirements.

Aquarion provided a spreadsheet showing the asset number of 32 specific assets that were retired, the amount retired and if it was a full or partial retirement. A request for more detailed information was made, and the Company provided the details of the SAP general ledger retirement entries which took place in August, September, and revised in October 2018. The detail identified the location, account number, number of feet, type of pipe, and original year of capitalization. Retirements were properly credited to account 101000 and debited to Accumulated Depreciation-Retirements, account 111010.

Calculated Rate of Return, Cost of Capital and Return on Equity

For comparison and informational purposes, Audit has compiled the calculated rate of return, cost of capital, and return on equity percentages, as determined within the context of each year's annual report desk audit. The most recently approved rate case DW 12-085, by Order 25,539 issued 6/28/2013 authorized an overall Rate of Return of 7.49% based on a cost of equity 9.6% and cost of debt 6.05%. The Company appears to have been overearning based on the Rate of Return calculations below, since 2013.

Re: Requests of Towns Related to Aquarion Water Company Service Issues

Dear Messrs. Welch and Apple:

The Aquarion Water Company of New Hampshire, Inc. ("Aquarion") values its relationship with the Towns of Hampton and North Hampton, and is firmly committed to delivering safe, reliable and high quality water to our customers throughout your respective municipalities. Similarly, Eversource Energy ("Eversource"), through its subsidiary Public Service Company of New Hampshire, distributes electric and gas throughout the State of New Hampshire and recognizes the critical importance of maintaining safe and reliable utility service. Recently, Aquarion and Eversource have had discussions with you regarding a series of issues the Towns identified to us in relation to Aquarion's service quality, water supply, fire protection and related concerns in Hampton and North Hampton. We take your concerns seriously, and we value our discussions with you, including our hope for continuing dialogue on these issues affecting your residents and our customers. To that end, we would like to take this opportunity to summarize for you several key points from our recent discussions and confirm Aquarion's and the Towns' actions in this regard.

In moving forward on the proposed acquisition of Aquarion, Eversource stands firmly behind Aquarion's commitments and its plans for service in the Towns, and these will not change under Eversource's ownership.

The understandings set forth herein are based upon both Towns' agreements, as set forth more fully below, to pay their outstanding bills in full by October 15, 2017 and not to oppose

Eversource's proposed acquisition of Aquarion. Moreover, this letter of understanding deals with on-going and routine operational issues outside of the present proceeding before the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission in its Docket No. DW 17-114; hence, this document is not intended to be presented to that Commission nor referred to during the referenced docket. Eversource, Aquarion and the Towns have agreed that should a party fail to honor its representations contained within this letter, the other party(ies) may bring the matter before the appropriate agency to request enforcement relief. The fact that a party made the representation will be admissible at such a proceeding.

- PFCs: Aquarion is firmly committed to investigating perfluorinated compound ("PFC") contamination that has recently been discovered as a threat to some of Aquarion's wells. Aquarion has developed an appropriate action plan and is taking decisive steps to address this issue. Aquarion's plan includes steps to address the Mill Road wellfield in coordination with the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services ("NHDES"), as well as steps to investigate potential PFC sources in proximity to Aquarion's other wells in collaboration with all stakeholders. Aquarion will be conducting testing of its wells for PFCs in accordance with the attached PFC Sampling Schedule (Attachment 1). Aquarion also intends to evaluate treatment to address PFCs in the groundwater in wells at the Mill Road wellfield in accordance with the attached Proposed Mill Road Wellfield PFC Treatment Evaluation (Attachment 2).
- Exeter Road Water Storage Tank: Aquarion is developing a plan to construct a new tank in the same pressure zone as the Exeter Road tank in Hampton (specific location to be determined). Based on the information we have today, Aquarion's current intent is that planning for the new tank will likely occur in 2018, design and permitting in 2019, and construction in 2020/2021. Aquarion has initially determined that the cost of a new tank will be approximately the same as rehabilitating the existing tank, which was Aquarion's original plan. There is value to having two tanks in the same pressure zone, therefore we will also evaluate the cost and benefit of rehabilitating the existing tank following construction of the new tank. Aquarion will evaluate the costs (and rate impact) of these options and will share that information with Town officials and the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission ("NHPUC"). Aquarion recognizes that Hampton officials are also concerned about disruption to their emergency communications antennae on the existing tank, and will work with Hampton to address those concerns.
- Large Groundwater Withdrawal Permit Application/Well #22: Aquarion is pursuing efforts to develop Well #22 as a source of supply to its customers in Hampton, North Hampton, and Rye, consistent with its obligations under RSA 374:1. Aquarion has retained Geosphere Environmental Management, Inc. to assist it with its permit application. In addition, we have reviewed the comments on our application from the Town of Hampton's consultant, Dr. Thomas Ballestero. Although some of his recommendations exceed what is required by the NHDES, we believe there is value in several of his recommendations. To that end, we plan to incorporate some of his recommendations into our Well #22 permitting plans. To ensure that the recommendations are deemed prudent and in accordance with all requirements of RSA Chapter 378, Aquarion will also be seeking input from the NHPUC. It is understood that

the Towns reserve the right to continue to participate in the Well #22 permitting plans of Aquarion before the appropriate regulatory and appellate bodies.

- <u>Hydrants</u>: As a result of meetings with the Towns, Aquarion has developed two report formats for hydrant maintenance: a summary report and a detailed report (Attachment 3). It is our understanding that officials from both Towns agree that these report formats are acceptable. Aquarion will provide quarterly hydrant maintenance reports to town officials within 30 days of the end of each calendar quarter using these new report formats. Aquarion will begin using these new report formats starting in 2018, with the first quarterly report due by the end of April 2018.¹
- The Towns have withheld payment to Aquarion for certain matters. The commitments made by Aquarion herein are conditioned upon the Towns paying all outstanding Aquarion bills on or before October 15, 2017, with no late fees or interest charges.
- Regular Quarterly Attendance at Board of Selectmen's Meetings and Attendance at other
 <u>Public Meetings</u>. Aquarion is committed to open communications with Town officials.
 Aquarion agrees to take the lead on scheduling a "stakeholder" meeting on a regular
 basis, inviting representatives of Hampton, North Hampton, and Rye, including providing
 quarterly updates to the Boards of Selectmen. The frequency of these meetings and
 updates will be periodically reviewed and mutually agreed upon by Aquarion and town
 officials.
- Inclining Block Rates. The Towns have requested Aquarion to make a proposal in its next rate case to implement inclining block rates. We believe this request is already addressed in that the NHPUC has ordered Aquarion to prepare a Cost of Service study for its next rate case. See Aquarion Water Company of New Hampshire, Inc., Docket No. DW 12-085, Order No. 25,539 (2013). Aquarion plans to investigate the appropriateness of inclining block rates in that Cost of Service study.
- Eversource Acquisition: In providing of this letter, the Towns have represented to the Companies that they will not oppose Eversource's proposed acquisition of Aquarion pending before the NHPUC in its Docket No. DW 17-114. The Towns have also expressed interest in several specific aspects of the pending acquisition of Aquarion by Eversource, and we are pleased to address the following issues related to the acquisition:
 - O Acquisition Premium. The Towns requested that "no acquisition premium...be put into the rate base or recovered from customers." This is consistent with Eversource's filing with the NHPUC. As stated in paragraph 20(d) of the Joint Petition pending at the NHPUC in Docket No. DW 17-114, "[t]he Joint Petitioners do not propose to record an acquisition premium on the books of account of Aquarion-NH as a result of the Transaction."

Please note that the 2017 hydrant maintenance activities will be reported using the same format that Aquarion used for its 2014, 2015, and 2016 reports because Aquarion has to re-configure its maintenance management system before it can start capturing information and reporting in the new report formats.

- O Savings to Customers and Transaction Costs. The Towns requested that "[a]ny 'savings' realized from the acquisition are to be reflected in lower rates to customers." The Towns further requested that "[a]ll transaction costs from the acquisition are to be waived and not charged to the customers." We believe these issues are also addressed in the Joint Petition. Aquarion and Eversource have requested the opportunity to recover transaction costs if and only to the extent that they can demonstrate savings from the transaction to customers in a future rate case. Transaction costs would be recovered only from net savings. Customers would see the benefit of any acquisition-related savings in a future rate case. It is understood that the Towns may, in the future proceedings, oppose the requested recovery.
- o Regular Provision of Financial Information. Aquarion is required to file detailed financial information each year with the NHPUC that is publicly available on the Commission's web site. NHPUC Staff audits these financials. Going forward, Eversource, as a publicly-traded company, makes financial information concerning its subsidiaries available on its web site. Based on the availability of this information, we believe the Towns will have access to comprehensive financial information.

Going forward, Aquarion looks forward to continuing to provide its high level of water service under Eversource ownership.
